1. Socrative – allows students to respond to questions during your lesson
2. Google Forms - allows students to respond to questions during your lesson

Productivity

1. Kingsoft Office- The tablet version of Microsoft Office. Students can use Word to type spelling words, create stories, and make lists, etc.
2. QR Droid (android) or QRReader (iOS) – reliable, easy-to-use qr reader
3. Accelerated Reader (AR) – allows students to take AR tests
4. RunningRecord – Calculates accuracy, pro version will be coming out soon to keep up with all of your students
5. iGradr (android)– grader for your tablet or phone OR

Groovy Grader (iOS)- grader for your tablet or phone

Classroom Management

1. ClassDojo – Point system for student behavior using personalized avatars
2. Too Noisy – A noise level meter that lets students visualize how loud they are being

Apps for Work Stations

1. ABCs Tracing Cursive Letters – independent cursive practice for upper and lowercase letters
2. SpellingCity – one of my absolute favorites; students can use this app to practice spelling and vocabulary words as well as word lists that are already on the www.spellingcity.com website.
